Dear physical therapy student,

We look forward to your clinical affiliation at The Johns Hopkins Hospital.

Rehabilitation therapy services within the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation provides a wide range of inpatient and outpatient services. The specifics of services provided and hours of operation are included on the Clinical Site Information Form (CSIF). The form can be accessed online via WebCSIF. The department is open 365 days a year. Your schedule will depend on patient care needs and your clinical instructor's schedule, and may include weekend coverage. Students are responsible for arranging their own housing. Please contact me if you are having difficulty with this.

While at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, you will have access to the online Welch Medical Library. Students with affiliations lasting eight weeks or longer will have the opportunity to act as a "clinical consultant," and as such will be expected to create a tangible project often with an evidence-based component.

If you have not received information from the ACCE at your school, please contact the Site Coordinator of Clinical Education (SCCE), Enjeen Woolford, three to four weeks before your clinical affiliation begins to obtain the name of your clinical instructor (CI) and the name of the service to which you are assigned for your internship. We would like to tailor your clinical experience to your specific learning style, educational interests and requirements. So that we may better understand your preferred learning style and previous clinical experiences, please complete and return the [learning style questionnaire](#) and [skills self-assessment](#) detailed on the website one month prior to your start date if you are a full-time student. Part-time students can bring the forms on their first day. We recommend that full-time students also include a resume.

The Johns Hopkins Hospital is located at 1800 Orleans Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21287. Travel directions are available [here](#). The main entrance to the hospital is on the Orleans Street. On your first day, park in the [Orleans Street Garage](#).

You will receive a welcome letter with the details of orientation and your schedule. Full-time students should report to Phipps 340 for hospital orientation at 8:00 AM on their first day. You will then be scheduled to have departmental orientation with Enjeen Woolford in the outpatient PT clinic in Meyer 1-130 later that week. Part-time students do not have to attend hospital orientation and should report directly to Meyer 1-130 to meet their CI unless instructed otherwise by their SCCE. Security guards are stationed at each entrance and can assist you with directions to any location in the hospital.

If your clinical internship is at our outpatient offsite satellite office at Green Spring Station, White Marsh or Odenton, please use [this website](#) to access clinic location and contact information.

You will still attend the hospital and departmental orientation as described above on the main campus prior to the start of your internship.

Please dress professionally. If you are placed in acute care or inpatient rehabilitation settings, there are specific color/style scrubs required. You will receive this uniform information in your orientation packet. In our outpatient settings, professional dress is required. Blue jeans and open-toed shoes are unacceptable. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email Enjeen. We look forward to your arrival.
